Worship in our parish

There will be a service of worship in Forteviot church on **Sunday, May 16th at 10:00 a.m.**

The Kirk Session has agreed that we reopen **Aberdalgie** church for worship on **Sunday 6th June**, the first Sunday in the month; and that we worship at **Forteviot** on **Sunday 20th June**, the third Sunday in the month. All services will start at 10:00 a.m. We propose to continue on this basis each month until the Covid restrictions ease or are removed.

On the second and fourth Sundays of the month there will be a service at Dunning, and if there is a fifth Sunday, there will be no service in either parish; but **every Sunday** a sermon and prayers will be on our website – www.aberdalgieandforteviot.co.uk.

Please remember that if you would like to attend worship in either of our church buildings you need to email or ring me in advance, to book a place. This is so that we comply with the track and trace rules. Please also remember to wear a face covering.
